



LONGITUDE 131°

CENTRAL AUSTRALIA, RED CENTRE – NORTHERN TERRITORY



In the crisp, white linen of a king-sized bed you find the serene, silent sleep of the desert. Above the sweeping canopy of your palatial tent floats a greater canopy, endless and sparkling. Constellations brimming with Anangu, (local Aboriginal people), tales and stories. You dream the rich dreams found only in the heart of sacred, powerful places. As one of only 30 guests, you awake to your own private view of the sun rising over Uluru (Ayers Rock). Reflecting countless colours, Uluru drenches you with its fabled light. The walls of your tent are a visual narrative, telling of the discoveries made by an early outback pioneer.

To savour all that Longitude 131° and Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park have to offer, guests must stay a minimum of two nights and one glance at the guest comments book reveals that many wish they'd stay longer.

LOCATION

Longitude 131° is situated on a sand dune close to the border of the World Heritage listed Uluru - Kata Tjuta National Park, just 6km from Ayers Rock Airport.

GETTING THERE

- Regular flights are available from most Australian capital cities to Ayers Rock Airport
- A deluxe 4WD transfer service operates from the airport direct to Longitude 131°
- Self drive is also a popular option with the drive from Alice Springs taking around 4½ hours.

Each elevated tent pays homage to an early Australian pioneer or explorer. Visual narratives adorn the walls and are central to the unique interior design. Understated, earthy natural tones, finishes and fibres are accompanied by an eclectic mix of classical colonial and contemporary pieces. Wardrobes and vanity basins, for example, replicate turn-of-the-century Australian food chests and wash troughs.

A white dome roof and flowing fabric draped from the centre create the illusion of camping. But unlike the early pioneers and explorers, guests revel in sublime comfort. The flick of a bedside switch is all it takes to raise the blinds and watch the spectacular moods of Uluru at sunrise. Meticulously designed to remain cool in summer and warm in winter, you have reverse cycle air-conditioning for complete control over your personal climate.

CLIMATE

Throughout all four seasons you'll find large temperature ranges between day and night. During the Australian summer months, temperatures range from 18°C/64°F (night) to 48°C/118°F (day). In the winter months, temperatures range from 0°C/32°F (night) to 30°C/86°F (day).

WHAT TO BRING

Humidity is low in the arid Red Centre. Days are sunny and can be hot, with cooler nights that can become quite crisp and cold in winter. You will need solid walking shoes, comfortable casual clothes and some layers of warmer clothes if you are travelling in the cooler months. Hat and sunscreen are essential all year round.

THE DUNE HOUSE

Offering five-star attention to detail, the Dune House is a stunning communal facility and central meeting place for all Longitude 131° guests. Situated in the middle of the camp site, here guests can enjoy breakfast, lunch and dinner while swapping stories of desert discoveries with other guests.

The Dune House also includes a library with maps, a comprehensive collection of historical and current books, games, a large screen TV (for those that need their fix) and a DVD player (with library). You may also take advantage of the superbly appointed (and stocked) bar, enjoying a refreshing drink in the lounge or out on the deck with stunning views of Uluru and the surrounding desert.
